Group News

Science and Technology Group

The November meeting of the Science and Tech Group at our home meeting place of St Firmin's Church Hall, Thurlby

The Subject of the November meeting was, Rutland Water, presented by Peter Ashworth.

The theme of Peter's presentation was the origins of Rutland Water (formally Empingham Reservoir), its geography and background information regarding the conception and construction of the reservoir and its accompanying recreation facilities.

The original concept was included in an Act of Parliament that specified that the site should contain car parks, sailing club, fishing facilities and nature reserve as well as being a reservoir.

Peter toughed on early resistance to the construction of a reservoir at the site notably from the NFU and how some landowners lost property to enable it to happen. Also, the archaeological dig that was required before the main construction was allowed to commence.

Peter was able to share his knowledge of the early work carried out at the site as he was involved from the early stages of the construction and had pictures of some of the early construction including the tunnel for the River Gwash that supplies some of the water for the reservoir along with water pumped from the Rivers Welland and Nene.



The presentation was concluded by showing a video taken during the construction that drew comments from the audience regarding the different attitude between then and present day to health and safety in the workplace. This video also linked in nicely with our meetings in July this year by one of the Leverton's family of Spalding as much of the industrial equipment had been supplied by them.

Wine group 3

From our very first meeting in August 2016, we have followed a number of themes in order to widen the range of wines sampled. Be it grape variety, wine for specific dishes. or from countries less associated with wine production, the intention has always been to extend the knowledge of group members. There comes a point however when a more relaxed approach is called for. Hence our current policy of allowing the host at each meeting to make their own selection of wines to be tasted.

For last month's meeting, therefore, we were offered two wines from the pinot grape. Not surprising as our hostess for that evening is a well-known champion of the brand. Both wines were

from New Zealand. A pinot gris to go with seafood and spicy dishes. A pinot noir recommended for roast chicken. They were both found to be very palatable when drunk on their own! One grape variety also featured at our November meeting: this time the grenache. From the Languedoc region in France came a blended white recommended for spicy and smoked dishes From Spain, where the grenache[a] grape was more dominant, a wine for poultry or pasta. The white wine was given the thumbs up by the group whoever felt that the red offering was somewhat lacking in body.

To celebrate another successful year for the group, our December meeting will be held in Bourne's very own wine and tapas bar.
