There are new people now, that I see in the street Faces that become familiar and a pleasure to meet People who are willing to be friendly and kind And new friendships formed to content my mind.


We all move on in time and space, So I enjoy the moment and keep in life's race. Time can never be dull with people out there With laughter and smiles to show that they care.


But I go up to bed, in the warm down I lay, I'll be alright soon, and greet another new day.
